CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES MONDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 2024 7:00 PM

IN ATTENDANCE:

John asked if we'd like to continue to have Orville Saunders take care of the snow removal. The charge last year was \$20 per removal. After some discussion, we decided to ask Orville if he is interested in continuing this year.

John also stated that he has extra yellow tape that he used to place in front of the lift door at ground level, and wanted to know if he should do the same at every door opening. Yes. He will do it.

ADVENT COLORS — One of the season's symbolic colors is blue, representing hope. During Advent, we wait in hope to celebrate again God's coming in human form. We also look forward in hope to Christ's coming in glory at the end of the age. Purple symbolizes the royalty of Jesus, the coming Prince of Peace, and the penitence with which we receive him. Some congregations also use pink or white candles in Advent wreaths, with pink symbolizing joy and white symbolizing the Christ Child.
